- founded in 1869
- the first Finnish-speaking girls' school in Finland
- in 1974 the school became part of the teacher training unit of the University of Helsinki
- one of the 10 teacher training schools in Finland
- the new school building built in 2003

Task by the Ministry of Education

 to improve and develop teaching, the curricula, and teacher training within the university



Functions of Viikki Teacher Training School of the University of Helsinki

I. Primary and Secondary Education

1) Basic education

- a) Primary school (grades 1-6): about 400 pupils, 19 classroom teachers and 6-8 subject teachers
- b) Lower secondary school (grades 7-9): almost 300 pupils and 69 full-time subject teachers

2) Upper secondary school:

about 250 students and 69 full-time subject teachers

II. Teacher Training

- 1. Class teacher training (approximately 150 student teachers per year)
- 2. Subject teacher training (approximately 200 student teachers per year)
- 3. Learning support teacher training (Special Education)


